The walking element of Shifting Lines uses a small web application, which runs on Android and iOS phones (and Linux).



THE INSTALLATION:

You'll experience Arshi's poems within a dynamic audioscape, accompanied by treated images, all arranged to give you, the listener,

a sense of the poems emerging from the landscape, water and shoreline of Cley Reserve. In fact, Mutiny's use of Resolume (7) software means that the video and audio inputs are actually processed in real-time within the space.

After exploring the installation experience in the visitor centre (around 15 mins), you can take a walk around the reserve with the 'field audio' version, listening to the poems in the spaces which inspired them.

WHAT YOU NEED

Headphones	You'll need headphones to fully enjoy this experience and not disturb people or wildlife around you.
Battery	We recommend that your phone is fully charged before you begin the experience and/or you have access to a spare battery pack.

Poems require a reading age of 8+. The installation will not support completely free movement, running or loud talking.

Younger children and babies in prams or pushchairs can be accommodated.

This is designed primarily as a standing experience. However, some seating will be available for people who are unable to remain standing for the duration of the experience.
